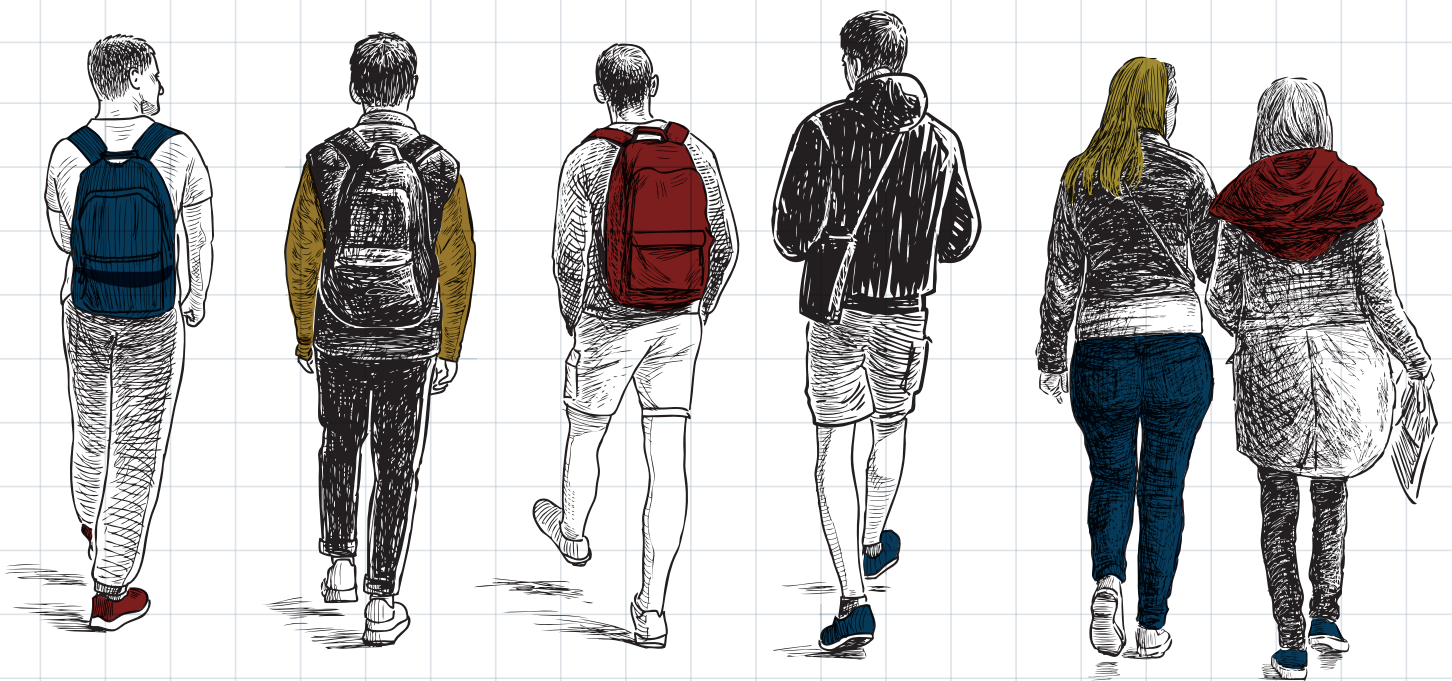

THE PROGRAMS OF NEW HAVEN

New Haven provides residential treatment, educational and vocational services and clinical intervention to more than 800 at-risk youth and their families annually. All programs are based on best practices that affect measurable outcomes.

In 2021 81% of our total operating budget went directly to benefiting the programs of New Haven, thus maximizing your donation.

Your donation to any of the New Haven programs ensures the continued success of the students.

The **Residential Treatment Program** runs 24/7 providing young men from 12 to 17 intensive clinical and educational intervention. Our career technical training courses are life-changing because they offer experience in real world careers.

The **Day Student Program** provides special education in a non-public school setting for students who have not been successful in traditional public schools. Behavioral and mental health issues as well as substance abuse, learning disabilities and truancy problems are treated.

The **Short Term Residential Treatment Program** serves adolescent youth with histories of horrific abuse. The program features intensive clinical and educational interventions that communicate the message, "You are safe; you are worthy; and here is where your journey begins."



Community Based Services (CBS) are short-term treatment for both males and females who have emotional and behavioral problems. The goal is to increase their success at school and at home.

Therapeutic Behavioral Services (TBS) is a medical funded program that provides behavioral coaching to youth who work alongside the family or caregiver to resolve targeted behaviors. Serving both males and females, the program focuses on eliminating behaviors that jeopardize the youth's current living situation.



The Compass

The drafting compass depicted in our logo represents the dynamic experience students have at New Haven. Graphically, the compass is in the shape of an "A," an educational symbol of achievement. As a drafting tool, the compass is representative of New Haven's innovative underpinning of trade skills as a motivational application of academic curriculum. Compasses measure distances, like the distance the boys will travel on their journey. As a navigation tool, a compass is synonymous with New Haven's role as a guide that helps at-risk adolescents find their way.

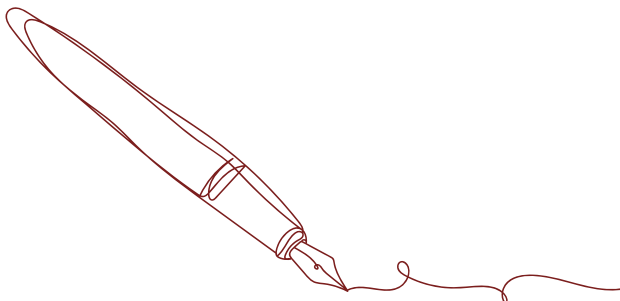
I didn't want to attend any school!

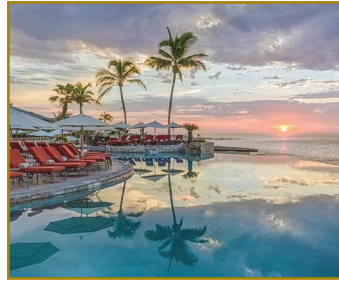
I didn't want to attend school, any school, especially not New Haven, but now I'm graduating from New Haven and attending college.

COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES - CBS



New Haven's Community Based Services (CBS) provides a short-term, intensive empowerment approach for families of children and adolescents who are transitioning from a residential treatment program or are at risk for residential placement.

The CBS program offers a spectrum of services that include individual and family counseling, case management, behavioral coaching and parent counseling.

Through CBS, families develop an effective support network, increase their sense of competence, acquire new skills for managing the special needs of their child, and have access to supportive community resources to build a brighter future.

How Does CBS Work?

- Individualized counseling for the child/ adolescent AND their caregivers
- Short-term intense therapeutic behavioral training at home or school
- Maintain the youth's placement at the lowest appropriate level OR assist in transitioning the child to a lower level of care
- Resolve behaviors that jeopardize the client's current living situation at home
- Refer and/or coordinate community-based support services needed to build resilience

Coping Skills Toolbag

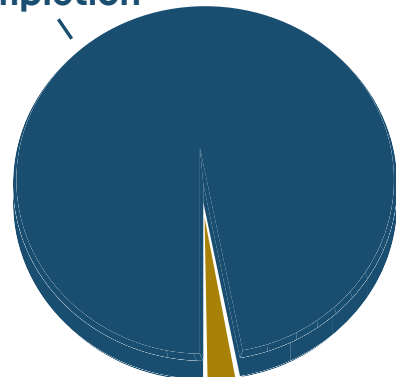

THERAPEUTIC BEHAVIORAL SERVICES - TBS



Therapeutic Behavioral Services (TBS) supports youth with serious emotional challenges and is administered by New Haven's San Diego and Riverside offices.

This short-term, in-home program is designed in conjunction with the caregiver and a team of mental health specialists as a supplemental service. The goal is to resolve and avoid the need for a higher level of care.

Therapeutic intervention is administered by a trained TBS coach who provides modeling, structure, support and immediate one-to-one intervention that assists the youth in managing and ultimately changing the troubling behavior.

How Does TBS Work?

- TBS begins with a comprehensive assessment of the youth and family
- The team identifies targeted behaviors that jeopardize the youth's current living situation
- A mental health treatment plan is developed and reviewed monthly
- A transition plan is designed to equip parents and/or caregivers with skills and strategies post intervention

Brandon was removed from his home and was scared being placed in a new setting. When he moved to New Haven, things began to change drastically for him. Brandon developed multiple friendships, learned coping strategies, and felt “cool” and “popular” for the first time.

Rec Room Revamp

Do you remember the fun times you had with friends when you were young? Maybe you were in the basement of your house or a den shared with siblings. Maybe you played ping pong or traded baseball cards - or just sat around on bean bag chairs and talked about nothing.

New Haven youth also need that kind of casual recreation. They need a place to retreat to that does not demand homework or chores. We want to create that space for them this year.

According to Ann Hoffer in an article for the University of Minnesota Institute on Community Integration, *"One of the primary reasons people participate in recreational activities is to socialize with others, which can result in tremendous benefits for overall well-being. Through recreation, people discover who they are as individuals and who they are as members of a group. They learn the give-and-take of relationships, appropriate manners and customs, and the skills necessary to make and keep friends. People also discover what gives them joy, passion, and meaning in life. Through recreation, people have new experiences, engage more fully in living, and develop healthy lifestyles."*



What Is Our Rec Room Vision?

"We envision a clean, organized space that allows the boys additional freedom to interact, discuss and have some fun with peers," explained Doreen Quinn, New Haven CEO. *"I see it as adding laughter to our campus and we all know that laughter is healing."*

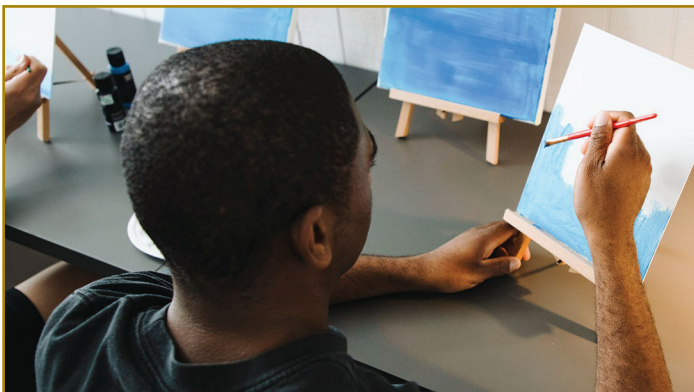
Right now, the Rec Room is empty. Our goal is to raise \$52,000 to transform this space to a welcoming, safe and fun place for our students to interact.

After just one semester, he became a leader, modeling successful behavior for peers, challenging students to participate in academics and leading the charge for the Culinary Program at the Holiday Bazaar.



CULINARY ARTS



The Catering4Youth Academy prepares students for culinary careers while teaching them important life and academic skills.

Designed to integrate industry-based standards with academic instruction, this innovative learning environment engages non-traditional learners and prepares them with the knowledge and skills necessary to graduate with a high school diploma and pursue post-secondary education.

In addition, it creates multiple pathways to entry-level opportunities in the hospitality industry.

The curriculum is delivered through engaging standards-based projects incorporating content knowledge in mathematics, English/language arts,

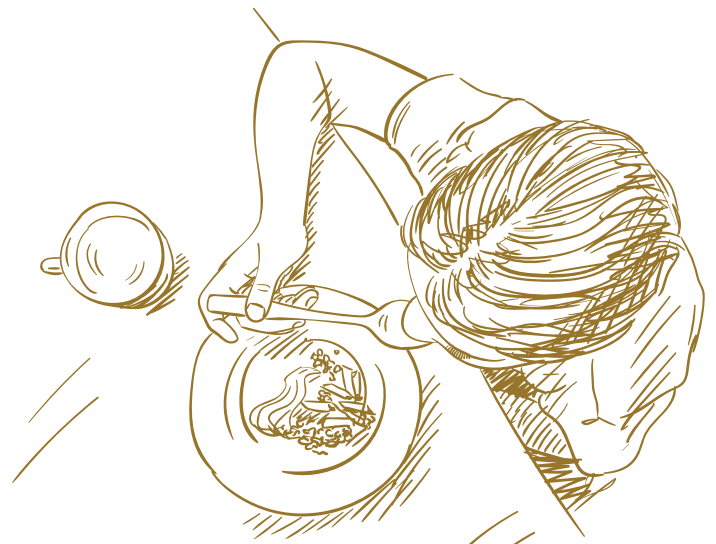
science and history/social science with a culinary arts thematic overlay.

Through the Catering4Youth Academy, the boys at New Haven hone their culinary and catering skills as well. Our Catering4Youth Academy is also a student-run catering service where the boys learn entrepreneurial and leadership skills.

New Haven's Woodcrafts, Etc. program extends traditional learning with the opportunity to learn valuable real-world job skills while gaining work-experience credits towards a high school diploma.

The Woodcrafts studio creates high quality products such as:

- Handcrafted ballpoint and fountain pens
- Cutting boards made from American hardwoods such as maple, walnut, and oak
- Adirondack chairs lovingly crafted of redwood or white pine

The combination of handcrafted items with entrepreneurial skills teaches a range of educational goals including:

- The technical skills of safe and high-quality woodworking
- Real-world business and e-commerce training
- Specific skills in inventory management, business plan development, accounting, marketing and even pricing strategies
- Leadership and responsibility
- Developing and achieving goals to prepare for a productive adult life

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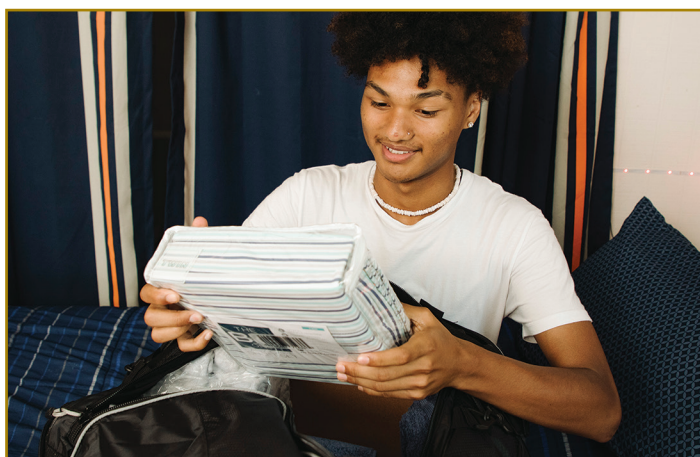

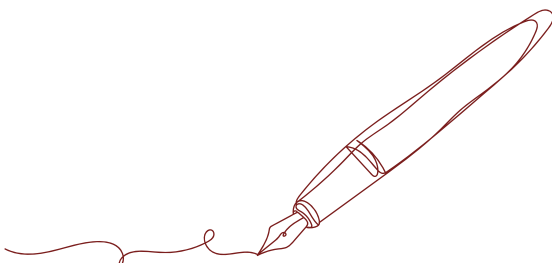
I learned to live independently.

New Haven taught me how to reach my goal of living independently.

”

Matthew had no connection with family and was in the “system” with out-of-state placements for the majority of his life. Significant trauma led to his inability to interact with people as well as extended periods of not speaking. When Matthew came to New Haven, he slowly came out of his shell and earned a Quarterly Award for performance. He was named Mr. Consistent and developed relationships with staff members, became a peer mentor, graduated early and planned his college enrollment for the fall of 2022.



coping skills

Jax is a 16-year-old male who suffered from Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder and Autism Spectrum Disorder. He was referred to New Haven’s Community Based Services (CBS) School-Based WRAP Around (WRAP) to address his school refusal and aggression towards people and property.

Jax was engaging in behaviors such as cursing at peers and authority figures, leaving the classroom without permission, refusing to follow teacher’s directives, physical aggression towards others, and engagement in destruction of property. Due to these behaviors, he had social difficulties and poor interactions with his peers.

The CBS team provided Parent Counseling, Behavior Coaching, and Case Management services. His parents learned effective behavioral strategies that could be implemented in the home. Jax learned coping skills to manage his feelings of anger and anxiety.

Jax successfully graduated from CBS after 10 months. At the time of graduation, he was able to positively engage with his peers and his parents. He was no longer exhibiting aggressive behaviors and was attending school regularly. At the six month follow up, Jax was continuing to do well by attending school regularly and spending time with family and friends.
