Message from our CEO

Daring to Dream in 2025

We entered 2025 INSPIRED and PURPOSED to do more for our students. Many have experienced multiple placements and school failures due to highly disruptive and difficult to manage behaviors. Over the last year, we have seen an influx of students with sensory integration challenges and have been focused on developing evidenced-based interventions and classroom practices for their success.



Neurodivergent students – those who are autistic, have ADHD or experience other variances in brain functioning – make up 50-60 percent of our students. Many present as extremely bright yet experience poor self-esteem, depression, anxiety, sleep issues, eating disorders, bi-polar disorder and/or trouble maintaining focus. They also process emotions, behaviors and learning in ways that differ from what is considered the norm.

We have doubled down on best practices for the neurodivergent student. For example, New Haven's Occupational Therapist and Speech and Language Pathologist have helped develop our Sensory Integration Classroom, known as the Zen Zone. Vital for student success, the Zen Zone combines a quiet workspace that allows students time to refocus with a calm-down retreat for self-regulation.

We will continue to access the best trainings, curriculums, interventions and practices in the care and education of our students. Join us and help champion our efforts! Visit, meet some students, see what we do. I promise, you'll leave INSPIRED and PURPOSED!

Designing Environments That Help Students Thrive

Remember the days when classrooms were just desks, chalkboards and that one squeaky chair? Suffice it to say, New Haven classrooms call for something much different. Sensory Integration therapy, a once identified clinical approach, has found its way into New Haven School.

Picture a diverse group of students using fidget tools, therapy putty, weighted blankets, sensory bins and headphones while learning algebra. It's like therapy and education had a quirky, colorful baby. Our New Haven classrooms are not just another Pinterest fever dream. The sensory sensitive classroom's approach to teaching students how to self-regulate is highly effective and the sensory tools really work! I will attempt to unpack the rise of Sensory Integration therapy in our classrooms, backed by a little research, a bit of humor and hopefully address some of your curiosity.

Sensory Integration interventions focus on helping our students process and respond to sensory input more effectively. Originally developed for

children with sensory processing disorder (SPD), autism and ADHD, Sensory Integration involves activities designed to calm, stimulate or organize the sensory system. Self-regulation is something everyone continually works on whether we are aware of it or not. We all encounter trying circumstances that can test our nerves. If we can recognize when we are becoming less regulated, overwhelmed or anxious, we are able to do something about it to manage our feelings and get ourselves to a healthy place. This comes more naturally for some, but for our youth at New Haven it is a skill that needs a lot of attention, intervention and practice.

New Haven adopted the Zones of Regulation curriculum because we believe that regulation is essential for empowering our students in their understanding of their feelings and emotions. Recognizing that regulation is essential for positive social, emotional, behavioral and academic development, our students are taught how to recognize when they are feeling dysregulated (anxious, frustrated, angry, sad, etc.). Using an ecological systems lens, the Zones of Regulation's theory of change recognizes that student experiences are situated within the context of their cultural identity, lived experiences and sociopolitical environment. By teaching the essential components for self-regulation, we believe our students can acquire the essential skills and competencies to develop positive social, emotional, behavioral and academic outcomes.





Meet Jonathan From Risk to Resilience

Jonathan joined New Haven just a short time ago. Prior to coming to New Haven, he had been in several placements.

In preparation for his arrival, our treatment team met to discuss the information provided by the referring party.

We then collectively combed through it to identify needs, challenges, assessment information and educational levels, but most importantly we tried to identify this incoming youth's hobbies, areas of strengths, hopes and dreams.

Jonathan, a very shy, self-reliant and self-conscious young man, noted in an interview prior to placement that he loved theater and hoped to "somehow do this for a living." It was his passion.

The team brainstormed how we might make this possible for this young man. The plan: we would approach Moonlight Studios in Vista for a donation of classes.

To our amazement, Moonlight Studios donated eight classes! Even more amazing, Jonathan signed up for Theater Improv!

Open curtain... BIG smile!

Now midway through these classes, Jonathan smiles when asked about theater, is almost giddy when he returns from the classes, and has a renewed interest in pursuing theater education.

Jonathan is now interested in volunteering at Moonlight Theater to stay connected to their wonderful mission. We suspect the folks at Moonlight know we'll be back... But only to give back this time.

What we do How Our Services Care. **Equip and Restore Hope**

New Haven is a community-based nonprofit social services agency providing residential treatment, educational and vocational services and clinical intervention to approximately 780 troubled youth and their families annually.

Based on best practices that affect measurable outcomes, our innovative and comprehensive therapeutic education model develops life/work skills in a healthy environment.





Our special education program works to engage and instruct youth who have been unsuccessful in public school due to behavioral, mental health, substance abuse, learning disabilities and/or truancy problems. We are contracted with 50+ school districts throughout Southern California.



In addition to day services, we offer a residential treatment program that runs 24 hours a day, seven days a week in 5 six-bed residences throughout Vista. We have outpatient and mental health offices in both San Diego and Riverside counties.



An important component of our comprehensive treatment program is **Therapeutic Behavioral Services**, where specialists coach struggling youth to recognize influences that trigger negative behaviors and exercise positive alternatives.



A short term, intensive empowerment approach, New Haven's **Community Based Services** provide services in-home and in the local community.

The goal of our agency is to extend an individualized continuum of care to each youth so that they can return to their family and community requiring little or no further intervention. Every resource in our organization is directed toward that goal. We have been an enduring steward of hope for more than 18,250 children and their families since 1967 and we look forward to empowering a new generation by breaking down barriers and building bright futures.

Teaching skills to turn dreams into independence




New Haven's Employability Program supports our youth in identifying potential careers that maximize their strengths and interests. Utilizing interests and aptitude career assessments, youth can narrow their focus to specific areas to explore further. New Haven's Employability Program organizes regular workplace tours, career tech training and explores local colleges and apprenticeship programs that can lead to licensing or certification.



Critical to our educational approach is the belief that the reluctant learner and/or challenging youth learns best when they can be engaged in learning situations that go beyond conventional classroom methods and that, in fact, "engagement" is the key to reducing behavioral problems and focusing the youth on the rewards of learning.

Not all young people have the desire or the ability to go to college. Many of them are anxious to be on their own and are interested in earning sufficient income to make it on their own. Like all young people, youth with histories of trauma and mental health challenges usually start out in entry level or low skills jobs. Unfortunately, many of them remain in these low paying jobs and continue to struggle to meet expenses and accomplish their personal goals. The importance of getting their high school diploma with some job skills is crucial for long term success.
